OLD BUSINESS

Trail Stations Update

Mark Shipley, of Mark Creative, is currently working on a copy of the sign heads for proofing, and will then make one of the ten trail station signs for board approval. The entire set of trail station sign heads and the large history sign of the entirety of Parkview Hills is expected to be finished late Fall 2010.

Boat Park Update

Overall, there has been a significant decrease in vandalism as compared to previous years. To deter vandalism more, a suggestion was made to rent out only one PHCA canoe for less traffic at Lake Hill N' Brook, thus removing the second canoe to Willow Lake for storage. Two other suggestions for solving the vandalism problem were building a dock box shed for oar storage, and installing a motion activated camera at the entrance to the beach.

There are still two open slots in the Boat Park for residents.

All unused boats stored at Willow Lake will be double checked to make sure they are safely locked and secure.

The current Boat Usage Policy and procedure system still needs an update.

Trail Trimming and Repairs

The trails have been trimmed by the Shores and other obviously-needing areas.

Chipper status: A written usage agreement is being drafted between Parkview Hills Management's Scott Vandeboss and the Parkview Hills Community Board. Once this agreement is signed, the purchasing of the chipper will proceed.

Adopt-A-Trail

There has been one new Adopt-A-Trail volunteer, Dan First. Another ad recruiting volunteers will be made out in the September edition of the Warbler.

The current groundcover of the trails has been determined to be too soft and uneasy to walk on. Current Adopt-A-Trail volunteers are going to make an active effort to rake off the large hard pieces of the groundcover to reduce uneven ground until more renovations can be made.

Jim Gunderson will take a presentation to the PHCA Board, requesting a \$5,000 budget for 2011 to widen the trails and improve the walking surface.

Recycling Area Security

It has been decided that the problem with dumping items at the Recycling Area is due to a lack of education about what items can and cannot be recycled. An article will be written in the September edition of the Warbler not only listing these items, but also informing the residents of where unrecyclable items can be taken around town.
