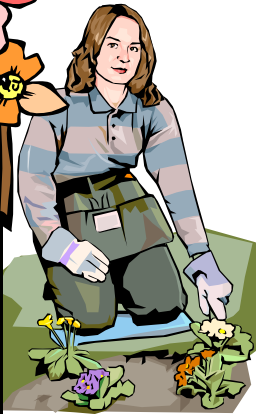

## Spring in the Prairie Garden

EILEEN MESLAR explaining her photographic series...*"I believe that every person, no matter their race, religion, beliefs, or economic status, should be treated with respect and equality."*

UNKNOWN contains three photographic series.

The first series, *Day Shelter*, includes ten black and white photographs of **Ministry With Community** members, Kalamazoo's day shelter. Over the course of five months, she got to know some of the members and took documentary portraits of them.

The second series is a continuation of *Day Shelter*, and it consists of nine diptychs, each one pairing a traditional portrait with an "object portrait." She photographed specific items **Ministry With Community** members carried with them. Her goal was to document the items these individuals believed important or always carried in order to convey more information about them without using words. In her current series, *Traveling the Tracks*, she is taking portraits of individuals who take a specific path along the train tracks in downtown Kalamazoo.

She interviews these individuals to learn more about them and the path they are traveling. She states, "Because few individuals I know would walk this path, I want to find out who would choose to walk along the tracks and why."

I photographed these people because I value them as individuals and believe they are important members of our community. Through these portraits, I want to emphasize the common humanity we all share and the need to value everyone in our community."
